This exciting seminar will feature what is actually happening in the classrooms of the Adel-DeSoto-Minburn (ADM) School District in regard to STEM. The middle school has implimented the Project Lead the Way Gateway to Technology (GTT) program. GTT is designed to provide middle school students with the knowledge and skills to create a strong foundation for further STEM learning with units on Design and Modeling and Automation and Robotics. The middle school has also implemented First Lego League.

In 2011-2012, the first course in the Project Lead the Way curriculum was offered at the ADM High School. Over 60 students took the Introduction to Engineering Design Course. This year, they added a Principles of Engineering course. The district has partnered with the Dallas County Hospital in Adel to implement a new Biomedical course for the 2013-2014 school year.
