

Working to Increase Student Interest and Achivement in STEM

Since 2012, an estimated 462,778 preK-12 students have participated in state-wide Scale-Ups. There is a correlation between participation in Scale-up and achievement in Math, Reading, Science, AND interest in STEM Careers and Working in lowa.

A higher percentage of students who participated in STEM Scale-Up Programs said, "I like it a lot" or were "very interested" in STEM-subjects, as well as in pursuing a STEM career and in working in lowa after graduation compared to all students statewide.

Scale-Ups in Review

A Year of Scale-Ups

Since 2012, the STEM Council has partnered with STEM education programs that have reached up to 100,000 young lowa learners each year, engaging them in exemplary STEM curriculum across the state. Thousands of educators in and out of schools across lowa have delivered exciting units in robotics, coding, engineering design, agriculture, animal science and more.

From January 2018-December 2018, 34,020 students and 564 educators in South Central lowa have received STEM training and materials through our Scale-Up Program Awards. Here is who received an award for the 2018-19 academic year.

2019-20 Scale-Up Applications Open January 21

The lowa Governor's STEM Advisory Council will release the menu for next year's STEM Scale-Up programs on January 14, 2019.

Applications open for these programs on Monday, January 21, 2019 and close March 4, 2019. Selected applicants will be notified of their award beginning in early April.



lowa's Scale-Up programs are selected with the goal of providing students rigorous, hands-on learning experiences. They begin with in-depth professional development experiences, all materials are provided for a classroom experience, and the state follows-up with a 2-part evaluation tool.

Scale-Ups are open to all formal and informal educators, including:

Festival Numbers

Since January 2018, 3,500 South Central lowans participated in our 7 STEM Festivals. The philosophy is two-fold, festivals are about learning, investigation and career readiness, but they're also about FUN!

The South Central Regional Hub partners with local community leaders and educators to host annual family STEM festivals. Exhibitors from throughout lowa spark student and parent interest with hands-on learning ranging from driving robots and trying virtual welding to testing chemical reactions and building structures. The BEST of 2018

We awarded \$25,000 to each of our 3 new BEST awardees, bringing the total number of Businesses Engaging Students and Teachers Programs to 50 in the state, with a total of 9 in South Central lowa.

Districts awarded in the South Central Region include: Des Moines Schools Central Academy, Ottumwa Community School District, and St. Theresa's in Des Moines. Here are some details about each program.


Second, the STEM Council is raising private dollars to pilot six more schools after the Loess Hills Elementary School model of including computer science in all aspects of teaching and learning. With the application opening in January, high-poverty schools are encouraged to apply.

Finally, the state has funded professional development opportunities for educators who wish to improve and expand their own skills. With \$500,000 from the Microsoft settlement and an additional \$500,000 from the state, educators in 49 districts across the state have participated.
